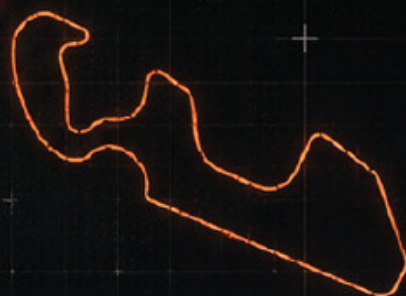

TRACK PROFILE & WHY ARAGON MATTERS

MotorLand Aragón rewards confidence on corner entry, clean direction changes and strong traction onto the long straight. With its mix of fast and technical sectors and significant elevation shifts, small mistakes get amplified. It's a Sprint weekend, so setup comes under pressure immediately.

This round should reward the riders and teams that arrive with a stable base setup rather than those searching for answers.

FORM VERDICT

MOST LIKELY TO SURPRISE

- » Raul Fernandez — if early confidence arrives, top-six pace is realistic.
- » Francesco Bagnaia — if qualifying improves, he can re-enter the conversation quickly.

SPRINT RACE PREDICTIONS

The Sprint is where races are won or lost before Sunday even begins. Short, sharp and relentless, it's a pure test of reaction, grip and nerve.

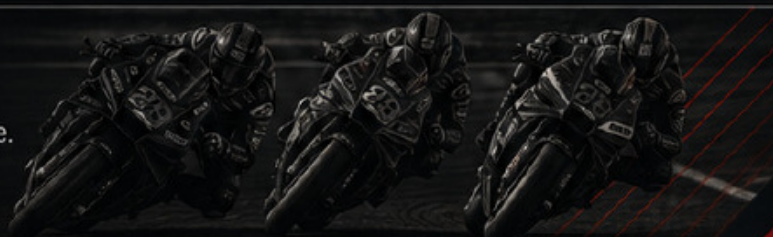

SPRINT VERDICT

The Sprint should be fast, tight and aggressive. Martin enters as the percentage call, but Marquez is the danger pick.



QUALIFYING & GRID BATTLE

One lap. No second chances. At Aragon, qualifying often defines the shape of the weekend. Here's how we see the fight for pole and the front of the grid unfolding.

POLE CONTENDERS

- 01 | MARC MARQUEZ** When the front feeling is there, few riders attack a pole lap harder.
- 02 | JORGE MARTIN** Current form and confidence make him a constant front-row threat.
- 03 | MARCO BEZZECCHI** Strong enough to steal pole if the bike rotates cleanly.
- 04 | AI OGURA** Disciplined and efficient, with every reason to expect another strong session.

KEY QUALIFYING THEMES

-  Q2 laps will be decided by tiny margins
-  Slipstream timing could matter late
-  Track evolution should improve grip session by session
-  One small mistake in sector three or four can cost everything

Aragon still rewards race craft, but front-row starts remain a huge advantage in both Sprint and Grand Prix scenarios.

Momentum and confidence make him a genuine top-six threat.



PEDRO ACOSTA

If the weekend stabilizes early, raw pace can rewrite expectations.



FABIO DI GIANNANTONIO

Consistency alone could put him in the podium conversation.
